2010 Scholarship Awards

The scholarship program is the primary focus of the Club's Vocational Service efforts, and results in the major yearly outlay of funds raised by the Rotary Club.

This year we are able to award four scholarships in the amount of \$2000 each.

The First Scholarship

Our academic award, was given to Chelsea Kann-Deere, who is graduating from Patuxent High School. She has been accepted to the College of Southern Maryland, and she will study for an Associate's Degree in Arts and Sciences. She then will transfer to the University of West Virginia or University of Maryland to obtain a Bachelor's Degree in Agricultural Education

The Second Scholarship

Our Brian Albright Award, named for a scientist at the Estuarine Research Center, was given to Patuxent High School graduate Kelsey Kreider who wishes to pursue studies

related to environmental sciences at Messiah College in Pennsylvania.

The Third Scholarship

Our Eddie Allen Vocational Award was awarded to Emily Berens, who is graduating from Calvert High School. She plans to attend the Minnesota State University in Mankato, Minnesota and study for a Bachelor Degree in Nursing.

The Fourth Scholarship

This Scholarship will be given to Rachel Manning who will be obtaining her Associates Degree from the College of Southern Maryland. She will continue her education at the University of Maryland or the University of West Virginia in order to receive a degree in agricultural education.
